

Palm is a pelvic organ prolapse patient advocate, vaginal and intimate health activist, internationally recognized speaker, POP key opinion leader, and prolific writer regarding POP physical, emotional, social, sexual, fitness, and employment quality of life impacts.

Sherrie has presented speeches nationally and internationally to physician, research, academic, corporate, government policy, and patient audiences since 2011. Her points of focus are raising awareness of the next significant evolution in women's health awareness, screening, practice, and policy, advancing global women's vaginal and intimate health empowerment, developing POP patient guidance and support structures, and bridge building within patient advocacy, white coat, and white-collar sectors toward the advancement of women's pelvic health and POP best practice.
