Since 2010, Association for Pelvic Organ Prolapse Support (APOPS) has been making every effort to lift the veil regarding the chronic, cryptic qualify of life ramifications of pelvic organ prolapse to women's lives. WHEN (Women's Health Empowerment Network) is a vision APOPS initiated in 2016, with intent to expand the energy in multiple directions based on diverse needs in the women's pelvic health sector. The WHEN has a core focus on the pelvic organ prolapse space, including comorbid intersects such as urinary incontinence, fecal incontinence, and intimate health. The vision for the #WHEN2024 Women's Pelvic Health Expo is a two-day hybrid event to include both lay women and the practitioners in the diagnostic space who receive insufficient curriculum in pelvic organ prolapse. The main event will occur live in Milwaukee in August 2024 and will be additionally accessible virtually. While hybrid events including both patients and practitioners are rare, APOPS feels it is critical we address shortfalls on both sides of the healthcare fence.

The women APOPS serves ask on a regular basis how they can access the POP curriculum provided to practitioners at conference, and it is time to address those needs. Day one will include a full schedule of experts in the female pelvic medicine subspecialty space, addressing the diverse POP dynamic. Day two will include sessions focusing on comorbidities and treatment tooling. Each day will include two industry lunch symposiums for women to choose between. We anticipate a filled industry space for this event; women are hungry to know more about treatment options, and APOPS will be making every effort to fulfill that need.

The WHEN Women's Pelvic Health Expo objectives are numerous:

- 1. Lift the shroud of secrecy that encases vaginal health in general, and pelvic organ prolapse specific.
- 2. Educate women about pelvic organ prolapse and associated disorders to enable them to recognize that symptoms they are experiencing are indicators of POP.
- 3. Encourage women to seek POP screening if they are experiencing symptoms.

- 4. Address the shortfall in diagnostic clinician POP curriculum to increase access to POP screening in a more standardized fashion.
- 5. Enable industry a platform to reach women with tooling to treat pelvic organ prolapse.
